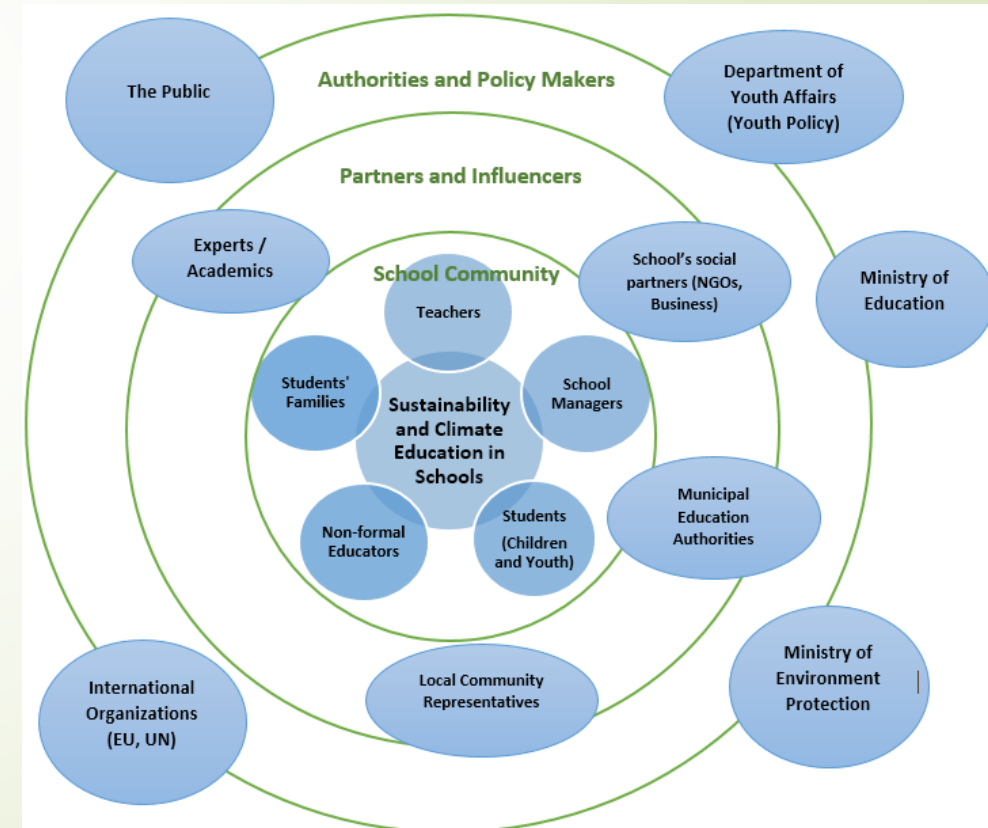
Overarching goal:

Overarching goal of the ERASMUS-project:

As part of the project, school staff and teacher trainers shall be trained to facilitate an ESD-based school curriculum development process to provide a specific concept for school quality management.
