How can we support research activity?

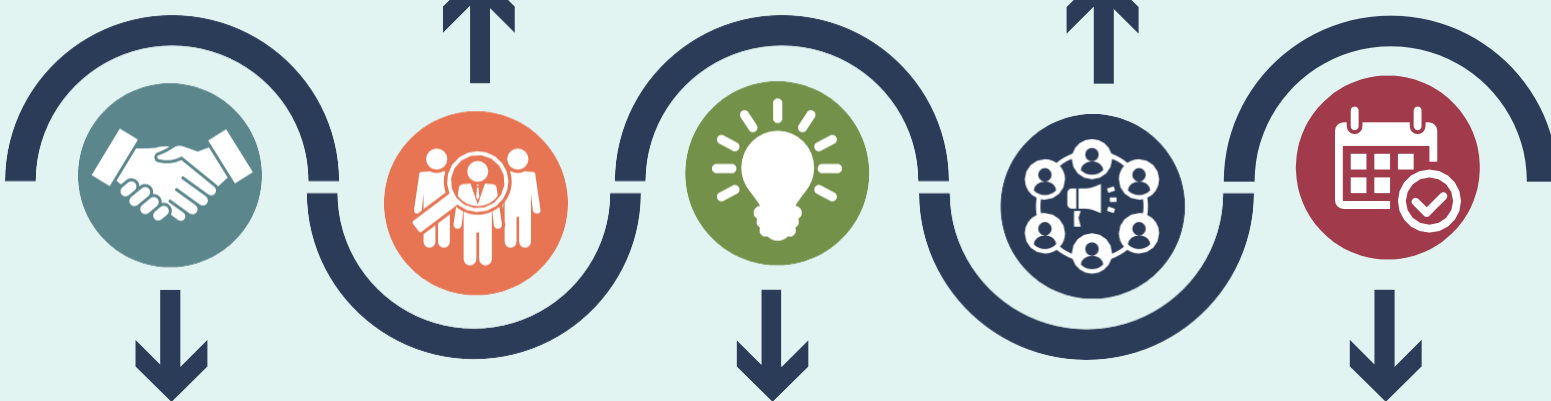
Our team will work with academic staff to facilitate and disseminate research in communities in the following ways:
